In the spring, I decided to try a new looping material from a new supplier. When I saw that the T-shirt yarn was also in fuchsia, the choice was clear :) Absolutely perfect to try. And on this year's vacation, I managed to finish the handbag.

MATERIAL INVENTORY

Canvas Size 2 (#5)

Looped Areas: 1 Ball Fuchsia and 2 Balls Black Shiny T-Shirt Yarn

Locking Medium: Black Cotton Yarn

Lining: cotton canvas with ornament

Handle: wooden, rectangular, black

Reinforced bottom: plywood 1.5 mm in size approx. 23 x 5.2 cm

Looping hook

Tapestry needle

Sewing needle

Thread in red

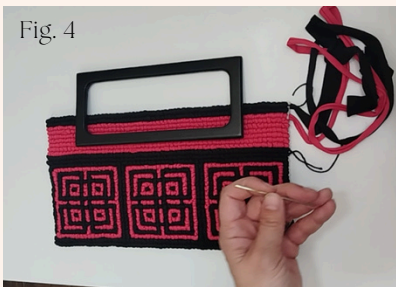
Permanent marker

Sewing machine

- 1 Cut 3 pieces of canvas: 2 pieces 65 squares wide and 39 squares tall for the front and back pieces and 1 piece 54 squares wide and 20 squares tall for the bottom piece. Fold over the edges of each piece of canvas by creasing the rows indicated by the gray areas in the pattern on page 5.



- 2 Start looping according to the pattern on page 5, or pre-draw the pattern on the canvas. To loop the pattern, combine Linear, Partial and Full Spiral Locker Hooking Technique - see Fig. 1.
- 3 Complete the pattern. Loop the next two black rows, the seven fuchsia rows, and the last two black rows using the Linear Locker Hooking Technique (Fig. 2).

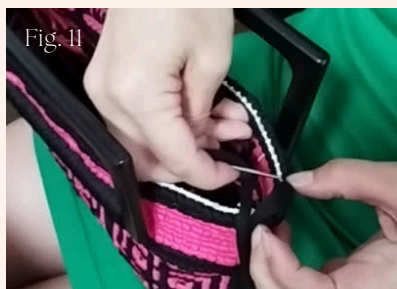


- 4 Loop the second part in the same way (Fig. 3).
- 5 Whipstitch the handle in the middle of the fuchsia row, using either fuchsia or black T-shirt yarn (Fig. 4).



- 6 Sew in the ends of the yarn you whipstitched the bag's ears (Fig. 5) by making a knot on the back side. Thread the rest of the end to the right side and hide it in the finished loops (Fig. 5).
- 7 In the same way, sew in all the loose ends of the locking and T-shirt yarns.

- 8 Loop the bottom of the purse according to the pattern on page 5 using the Spiral Locker Hooking Technique.
- 9 Place the front and back parts on top of each other and whipstitch the edges of the handbag together with a tapestry needle (Fig. 6).
- 10 Take the bottom piece and find the center of the bottom piece on the short side (Fig. 7).
- 11 Pin the center of the bottom piece to the seam on the bottom of the bag (Fig. 8) and begin to whipstitch the bottom to both parts of the handbag with a black T-shirts yarn (Fig. 9).
- 12 If you want, attach protective feet to the bottom of the handbag (Fig. 10).



- 13 Whipstitch the upper frame edge of the purse (Fig. 11).
- 14 Sew the lining of the handbag from the cotton fabric (Fig. 12). Create pockets on it according to your wishes. Sew two sets of magnetic closures on it at the ends equidistant from the center.
- 15 Hand sew the lining to the inside of the purse with a back stitch (Fig. 13).

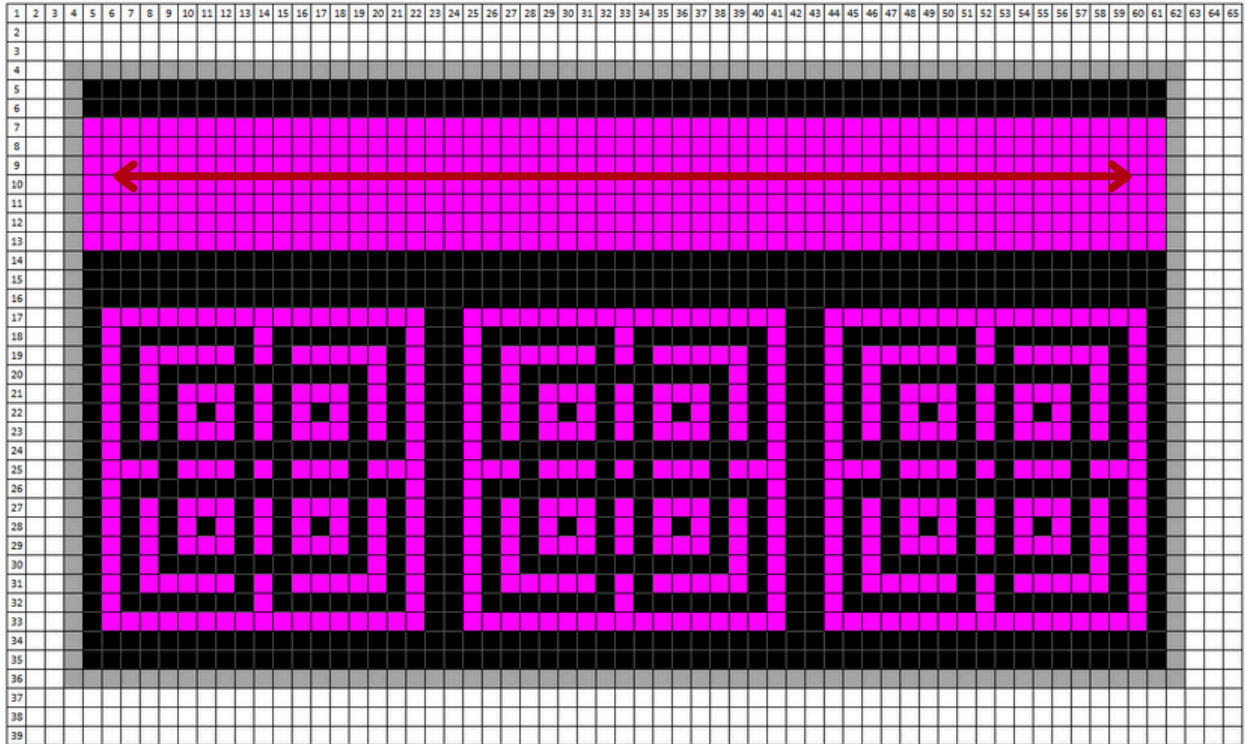


TIPS FOR YOU
